1 **Constitution** - It was the year in which we drafted and then voted our constitution. This was accepted in March. So March is now our AGM meeting goalpost.

It is wonderful to know that even our structure is highly democratic and dynamic. We have the named post as per constitution, but also rotational roles so that everyone feels engaged and involved and constantly reminded that this is Our group we all contribute so that it is so great.

We have a very innovative and super fun structure.

- Voted positions- these are permanent, voted roles named in the constitution. The person voted for this job is taking the main workload associated with the role. They also pick up the slack if something major is happening. The person in this role knows all aspects of their role. Should they need support with some aspects of their activities in it is their responsibility to find help.
- Volunteered jobs for a meeting- these are the chair of meeting and the secretary of the meeting. They are on a rotation and volunteering basis to each member of the group. It is crucial activity in reminding each other that it is our group, we can only be as exciting and as amazing as the energy we contribute to the group. Empower each other talent with care.
- **Voted Positions**: these are the four positions in the constitutions. They are voted and people in this positions carry the overall responsibility associated with the role.
- **Chair** organises the strategy and membership for the group. Knows the projects and people and helps with contribution and communication. Briefs meeting chair on how to chair meetings.
- Secretary organizes documentation both digital and other. Briefs meeting secretary on how to do agenda and minutes of the meetings for the meeting they have volunteered for.
- **Digital Officer** organizes branding and digital presence.
- **Treasurer** organizes finances. Responsible for bank account, supports the chair with funding opportunities by planning budget for events and activities.
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- Chair of the meeting organizes the meeting and keeps the pace during the meeting. Reminds everyone to be more chop-chop rather than chit-chat. Turns up 15 min before the meeting. Detailed duties done by Kim.
- **Secretary** organizes agenda before meeting. Takes minutes of the meeting. Submits them to Voted chair afterwards.


1 Bank account

To date the demonstrations were given by

Uisce- embroidery (now former member) We started the year on a high note with a demonstration from Uisce, one of our founding members. Her work was really inspiring and the stitches she thought us were interpreted in many different ways in the projects developed by members throughout the year

Niki – e-learning set up for teaching online using Zoom. This was quite technical and Niki did not focus as much on her practice. She shared her positive experience working with a large and diverse groups throughout the year. Highlights for her were Artist in Residence for August Craft Month with the University of Atypical. Niki talked about the behind the scenes drama as well as her sense of belonging that elearning enabled.

Mary- gave an amazing demonstration on different

types of quilting and her skill and teaching kept us mesmerized for an hour. Loved hearing about how her artistic practice has evolved especially as she is one of our heroes and a multiple time winner of the RDS Craft Awards.

Cosima – we were so inspired by Cosima's demonstration of fabric manipulation and smocking. It is a skill that requires precision, patience and very nibbly fingers. She used up a beautiful silk fabric. It was useful to see how much material is used up in making smocking. There was an interesting discussion where smocking was originally use and why.

Jane - game a wonderful demonstration of how to create your unique fibre mix using variety of





fibres: silk, wool and viscose, reclaimed felt remnants, and neps and silk hankies. After her bland is created she uses it in her signature textures to create pictures and sculptural wok alike.

Aine -gave us a brilliant demo on how to spin yarn. Her tips and trick on how to hold the spindle, how to grab the fibres and what produces a great yarn were really informative. Her skill is exceptional and we learned so much.
